Maths Market Place

At our Maths Market Place children from P1 to P7 shared their learning in place value (the value of each digit in a number). They confidently explained to interested parents (and grandparents) how they use different resources to help with their understanding about units, tens, hundreds and thousands.

The children used cuisenaire rods, number lines, numicon and arrow cards to show how place value is used to help them 'see' calculations.
