The story focuses on an adventure and working through different obstacles to get to your destination! Please choose 5 of the suggested tasks to complete at home with your child. This will help familiarise them with the story in preparation for the tasks we will be completing in school.

<p>Visit YouTube and watch 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' animated story read by Michael Rosen.</p> <p>Read the book at home.</p>	<p>Have your own 'Bear Hunt' at home. Hide all your teddies/soft toys/toys around the house and give each other clues to find them. Think about using specific directions – under, besides, forwards, backwards etc.</p>	<p>Can you listen to the story and perform your own version for others?</p>	<p>Make a map of all the places the family visit on their adventure.</p>	<p>Make your own sensory version of the bear hunt at home to walk through in your bare feet! e.g. water, grass, mud...</p>	<p>Make your own puppets to enjoy retelling the story with.</p>
<p>Think and talk about a time when you've felt nervous or scared. Can you draw this? Can you describe what made you feel better?</p>	<p>Make a picnic lunch together. Think about opportunities to prepare food, cut food and tidy up as a team.</p>	<p>Make your own 'Bear Hunt' obstacle course and practice going under, over and through different obstacles. Use a timer to see how fast you can go!</p>	<p>Design and build a 'Bear Trap!' using any available resources e.g. Lego, junk, furniture.</p> 	<p>Read, watch and enjoy other stories with bears in them, Talk about how the bears in each story are different.</p>	<p>Music – Sing the story out, clap along to the rhythm of the story, use instruments to match different parts of the story.</p>
