#### Bonus Ball

Each week a number which corresponds to a number on the register is randomly selected, the Bonus Bal. The Bonus ball children come along to my office to share learning, and or discuss school improvements. We have discussed the following:

## What would improve their writing?

Almost all children shared they enjoyed writing tasks, teachers helped them by telling them something good and something to improve. Some older children would like more opportunities to type on the pro books – with a mouse. All children said having a word bank or word wall would be very helpful as it can be hard to find the right words.

## What would improve the playground?

All children would like changes made to the playground environment, at the front and back. I explained this is in progress and we are waiting for the Concept Design to be created, and when I have it, I would share it.

Soft start, snack time and Choice Friday.

All children shared they enjoyed "soft start", having time to catch up with work first thing in the morning was helpful, and having a little quiet time reading. Others shared it was a good way to refresh your mind before the hard work started. Younger classes shared it was good to play a little before working and got you ready to learn. Almost all children said it was a good way to transition from home to school.

All children shared having an indoor snack, milk break was a good thing. They liked being able to "decompress", after breaktime said a p7, and others shared it helped us be an ECO school. Other children shared it was relaxing, they enjoyed finding out about things on the news or listening to a story their teacher was reading.

Almost all children shared "Choice Time", was a good experience, they liked the opportunity to be with friends and play games of their choosing, it also provoked a variety of responses as the children had different experiences to share.
