The animated meeting was chaired by Russell Armstrong. It was good to hear feedback from the class reps, and discussions were enthusiastic and encouraging. Thank you for being a great school community. Much of the discussion centred around communication on Microsoft teams; how to access being one point. There will be a separate follow up on this with potential drop in sessions to support. Microsoft teams is the preferred platform for the city of Edinburgh council, and more specifically is used by Craigmount High School to support learning.
