Remembrance Ceremony

P6 and P7 were invited to the Remembrance Ceremony today at Murrayfield Stadium. All children showed respect and honoured those who have given their lives in conflicts along with representatives from Scotland, New Zealand, Edinburgh and Glasgow Rugby teams and Police Scotland. The sun shone, and the bagpipes played, then the wreaths of poppies were laid. P7 House Captains Lola and Emily laid the Roseburn Wreath- what a special moment. Maria P7, read the war poem she had written to the captive audience. Just amazing. Very well done all.

Assembly

Our assembly today was a Remembrance Assembly, and we shared the story behind the poppy and some key messages. The children were very engaged and responded thoughtfully to questions. We also focused on Article 38 of the UNCRC, which covers how the rights of children relate to the armed forces.

Children and young people should never be forced to fight in the armed forces or go to war. This right covers all jobs in a war, so doesn't just apply to soldiers.
